St Mary's, Parochial Church Council report to Parish Council - May 2021

It has been a strange year for everyone. The church was locked for the first time in many years, before opening for private prayer at weekends and then unlocking again.

Services have been once a week for the benefice (eleven parishes) either in person or on zoom (depending on rules).

The Benefice Remembrance service, held on our green, needed to be limited to two people from each parish and was poignant as always. The names of our five soldiers were read alongside the soldiers from the other parishes.

The Christmas Carol service was a light in the darkness as we held our torches aloft. It was totally outdoor, travelling around the village. It was so good that many people attended who do not usually come to church and each family received a bag of goodies to take home.

When Easter came around, we were permitted to sing outside the church and the sun came out.

Financially, it has been an even leaner year than usual, with few services in the church and all fundraising events on hold. The accounts showed quite a deficit.

The cost of repairing the roof and tower is £112,313. We have applied for four grants, two have been granted (£3900 and £9000) and we will hear about the other two in the next few months.

The Grand Music and Film sale is scheduled to take place in July and already we have over 1500 DVDs, 800 CDs and 1100 vinyls. We are hoping to be outside in the churchyard and to raise lots of money for the roof and tower appeal.

We continue to work alongside Suffolk Wildlife Trust to 'wild' the older part of the churchyard and are encouraged by the wild flowers which are appearing.

We remain so grateful to those who support the church and churchyard either by giving their time and skills or helping financially. It continues to be a place loved by many, some religious, some not – everyone is welcome.

<u>Homersfield Community Park</u>
Report for the Annual Village Meeting May 2021

The number of trustees has increased by two to five and the change to a CIO has been completed. The charity is now called the Homersfield Community Park. We greatly appreciate all Nick's hard work and we'd like give our grateful thanks to him. The next step is to register the land as belonging to the charity, but if we cannot find sufficient evidence of the land being given for a playing field, or the evidence that the Land Registry will accept, we may have to consider adverse possession. We have asked the Parish Council to take on the land either to be kept as a playground or as a community space, but that would be the council's decision and after the land has been registered. Any funds in our account would go with the land.

There are regular checks of the equipment and fences etc throughout the year by the trustees. These checks have shown that the equipment need repairing and the fence needs renewing. We have enough funds to fix the equipment or renew the fence – including the installation of safety gates, but not both so the trustees reluctantly decided to close the playground

There has been no fund raising this year and the only expenditure has been the insurance of £210 leaving £1840 in the bank.
