MOLE


The weather has been mixed, a short few days of minus temperatures, then rain and then high temperatures. It's no wonder that there are so many 'bugs' going about.

FROM THE TRACTOR CAB

Avian flu is still rife in the bird population, many thousands of domestic birds have died and wild birds too. All domestic birds must be housed by law. This is to try to protect them. Several birds have just migrated to these shores in the first week of January, blackbirds, starling, chaffinches, robins, fieldfares, redwing and waxwing. Many come over to join the resident populations. Much depends on the weather in Europe, as it gets colder, they will leave, if as this year it's been milder many are only now coming.

Some like the mysterious woodcock fly over the North Sea on a full moon, quite often hit the dunes on the coast before recuperating and joining their English cousins. Hares, rabbits and deer are enjoying the mild climate as there is still greenery to eat. The Brown hare, also called European hare, is now considered naturalised as it was believed to be introduced by the Romans. Known in rural parts as a 'Sally' they differ from rabbits, they are larger with black tipped ears and they do not burrow, but shelter in 'forms', which are shallow depressions in the

ground. They have been known to reach speeds of 45mph. Also, unlike rabbits they are solitary or paired, using their speed and jinking run to escape. They can produce 3 or 4 litters a year of up to 4 young called leverets. In the Spring they are often seen Boxing, which is part of the mating game.





ST JAMES ORCHARD

The orchard meadow had its final all-over-cut quite late this year, in fact the rather extreme during the year meant that it had significantly fewer cuts altogether.

Over the past few years, we have lost a number of the trees originally planted, some due to disease or insect attack (the latter in particular finished off all the apricots, a shame as it was one of those that gave the first fruit the orchard ever produced) and some that may not have been the best choice for the soil conditions (e.g. cherries). So, we decided to fill in the gaps with new trees in December. We added an extra Orleans Reinette apple, as this is a very popular variety with villagers, and some varieties new to the orchard – an apple Pitmaston Pineapple, a pear William's Bon Cretien and an Oullin's Gage greengage. Thanks to Alan and Jeremy for help with digging, planting, staking and fitting the tree guards.

Soon we will be looking to do the winter apple and pear pruning and rounding up the orchard volunteers to help with this.

The Flixton Speed watch Team has been up and running for several months now and has deployed numerous times in the village. I believe we have been effective in starting to get the message out to motorists and remind them to slow down. When you consider all roads in Flixton have 30MPH speed limits, we have caught some motorist speeding at well over 40 MPH. We all know that if a child or someone's pet steps out into the road in front of a speeding car, there is a far greater chance of causing serious injury or worse still death.

Everyone in the Flixton Community Speed watch team is a volunteer. We only operate within the village itself and in conjunction with Suffolk Police. We are looking for some new members to join our team. If anyone would be interested in joining, then please contact me. We only ask volunteers to make themselves available for an hour or two each month. You will be given all the necessary training and I can assure you it's not difficult. The idea behind the scheme is to educate motorist to try and encourage them to keep to the speed limits because it is well known that speeding is a common cause of road collisions and affects the lives of many people in our towns and villages.

Another great party rocked St.Margarets Village Hall, Music, bands and someone off the TV entertained us all!


My New Year Resolution was to have a healthier diet,



We are keen to hear from anyone who feels they can offer some time volunteering. No amount of time is too small and there are often weekend opportunities too.


